What is Irlen Syndrome/Scotopic Sensitivity Syndrome?

Irlen Syndrome or Scotopic Sensitivity Syndrome (SSS) is a sensitivity to light that can significantly interfere with reading and writing activities. It can lower test scores and impair a person's ability to function in school and work situations. It can co-exist with dyslexia, learning disabilities, attention deficit disorder, autism, and some emotional or behavioral disturbances. Irlen Syndrome/SSS cannot be diagnosed using standard educational, psycho-educational, or speech and language tests. Fortunately, this syndrome can be diagnosed and treated. Learn how to diagnose and ameliorate Irlen Syndrome using the Irlen Screening method and Irlen Colored Overlays.

In Europe, this is called Meares/Irlen Syndrome or as Remedial Chromotherapy.

How do you screen for Irlen Syndrome?

The Irlen Screening Process is efficient and economical. The testing and remediation can be administered individually in 30–60 minutes, and results are immediately known. Irlen testing can be administered alone or as a part of a test battery. The Irlen method is currently being used in schools throughout the world, as well as in clinic and private practice settings.

How do you become trained to administer the Irlen Screening Test?

To become a Certified Irlen Screener, you must participate in a two-day workshop with a Certified Irlen Trainer. Who is qualified to be trained to screen for Irlen Syndrome?

Educators, reading specialists, special education specialists, school nurses, psychologists, speech pathologists, occupational therapists, counselors, teachers, and diagnosticians can qualify to be trained as Irlen Screeners. Certain other professionals may also qualify on a limited basis. To register for the training workshop, submit a completed application form, a professional one-page resume featuring your training, and the training fee or purchase order. *If you are not accepted for the training workshop, the entire fee will be returned to you.*
